

This booklet is about where you can get help with looking for a job and get started with your research. **Research means looking for and finding information.** You may also find other opportunities and organisations in your local area.

Useful local links and organisations



job centre

A **local job centre** will have employment advisors who will help you with any questions or worries you have around employment.



group

Find **Local Action Groups** or **community groups** that get together to talk about community activities, people will help and give you advice about getting a job.



newspaper

You can also look through **local newspapers and job boards** at your local supermarket to find jobs you might like to apply for.

ECL work in Essex and West Sussex. They offer Work Based Training opportunities, which provide time-limited work experience within a fully functioning business. These training opportunities are in catering, conferencing, hospitality, horticulture, printing and recycling and packaging.

Frontline works specifically in Brentwood, Essex and the surrounding districts. Their Hours Worth programme offers supported employment opportunities while their other programmes offer skills development in the community.

Access to Work

If you need support to do your work, you can apply for an Access to Work grant. There are some rules around when and what you can apply for, so make sure you think of different options before you apply. You can find out more information on the government website:

BASE is a membership organisation. It has access to lots of other organisations who can give you specialist support to get you into supported employment. They can give you advice at all stages of job hunting, from building your confidence and getting training, to matching your skills with the right job, to on-the-job support.

Boss is an information and advice organisation. They can give advice on how to find a job coach, how to get into supported employment and even self-employment. They also run workshops and events where you can find out more about their work.

3. How to set up your own business



Dolphins' Den

Dolphins' Den is a project run by Thera that helps people with a learning disability and/or autism to set up their own business or community project.



workshop

Dolphins' Den is made up of workshops and mentoring with a mentor from the local business community.

The workshops can help you think about your skills and ideas and what you need to set up a business or project.



mentor

During the mentoring, you can get one-to-one support from your mentor who will meet with you outside the workshops and help you develop your project.



wait

The Dolphins' Den project does not run all the time. This means that you might have to wait some time before the workshops come to your area.



booklet

If you want to start working on your project idea now, you can ask your support worker to get in touch the Dolphins' Den project. The team can send you some step-by-step booklets to help you start working on your idea and give you some tips.


