What is the flu?

Flu is a common **infectious illness** spread by coughs and sneezes. It can be very unpleasant, but you will usually begin to feel better within about a week.



Commons **symptoms** are: a dry cough, headache, a sudden fever, diarrhoea or tummy pain.





What is a vaccine?

The flu vaccine is the best **protection** we have against viruses that can cause serious illness among the elderly and vulnerable people.

How is the flu different to coronavirus?



You could have coronavirus (COVID-19) if you have the following:



• A high temperature





a loss or change to your sense of smell or taste



If you think you have coronavirus, you should self-isolate and get a test.

Can the flu vaccine cause flu?

a new, continuous cough



No. The vaccine does not have any live viruses in so does not give you the flu. You may get a slight temperature, and your arm may feel a bit sore where you had the injection.

I had a flu vaccine last year do I need one again?



change

Yes. The virus can **change** every year so you will need to have a new one to make sure you are protected.

Who can I contact to get a vaccine?



You can speak to your **doctor (GP)** who will be able to tell you what you need to do.



If you do not know who your doctor is or need **help**, then ask your support worker.
