


reflect

This is the first prize design from Scott - we loved it so much it was our Thera (Scotland) Christmas card.




This is Jimmy's Christmas card design. It won second prize and Jimmy now has the design on a mug to keep forever.

We are also planning a Burns Supper. This will obviously be before our Chinese celebrations - we are designing a 'tartan tablecloth'.




We are having 'haggis, tatties and neeps' and do hope that we can get someone to address our 'haggis' as this is a Scottish tradition.
